

Supplier Attestation Document for Organic Ingredients Destined for Mexico

The Mexican Organic Products Law (Ley de Productos Orgánicos) requires that ingredients used in products sold in Mexico comply with the requirements in the Mexican regulations. Suppliers of ingredients to the final processor may self-attest that the ingredient meets the requirements listed below. CCOF has developed a list of crops that are at high risk of being grown with these materials and/or methods. See www.ccof.org/mexico for the current list of high-risk crops. Crops at high risk for sodium nitrate use include carrots, celery, some cole crops, fresh tomatoes, some leafy greens, some grains, onions, potatoes, tobacco, some citrus. Crops at high risk for hydroponic or aeroponic production include container grown annual crops (excluding annual seedlings) and container grown strawberries.
